Re: Revised Continuous Emission Monitoring System (CEMS) Code

This is to advise that revisions to the 1998 Continuous Emission Monitoring System (CEMS) Code are complete. The revised (2021) CEMS Code takes effect January 1, 2022 and will replace the 1998 CEMS Code. Industrial facilities are required to comply with requirements in the revised Code on or before January 1, 2022.

Authorizations to deviate which were granted under the 1998 CEMS Code apply to requirements in the 1998 Code. Industrial facilities seeking authorization to deviate from requirements in the 2021 CEMS Code should work with their approval coordinator to have any such deviation authorized before the revised Code takes effect. Installation requirements in the revised Code apply only to new installations going forward, therefore existing authorizations to deviate which are based on physical installation requirements (i.e. sampling location) may remain.
