## Alberta Outbreak Reporting Form (AORF) - Definitions(1) and

The following information highlights the exceptions to standard reporting instructions when reporting a TB outbreak.

Examples provided in this document are not all-inclusive. They are included to provide guidance to the person completing the form. Please refer to disease specific case definitions in the <u>Alberta Public Health</u> <u>Disease Management Guidelines</u> for identifying confirmed, probable and suspect cases.
