**MANDATORY QUALIFICATIONS**

**All inspectors must have successfully completed NFPA 1041 Level 2 AND the NFPA Standard/Levels to be evaluated at this site.** Please attach a copy of your IFSAC or Pro Board certificate(s). If you do not have IFSAC or Pro Board certificates, please attach a copy of your transcript(s) from an approved Alberta training provider. **Those trained outside of Alberta without NFPA certification are NOT eligible to inspect training facilities.**

**INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS**

- The inspector must not be employed by the facility/site owner and is acting on behalf of the Office of the Fire Commissioner.
- The inspection must be conducted objectively and without bias. Evidence of the site owner influencing the results of this inspection will nullify the site’s approval.
- The inspector must consider both the safety and the suitability of the facility for hosting a valid NFPA evaluation.
- The inspector must check the site against all the OFC’s skills sheets for the level to ensure all skills can be demonstrated.
- The completed inspection report must be submitted directly to the OFC by the inspector.

**SITE REQUIREMENTS**

- All fire training facilities (including structures, props, trenches, confined spaces, rappelling walls, etc.) should conform to *NFPA 1402 Guide to Building Fire Service Training Centers* and *Occupational Health and Safety Act, Regulation and Code*. Some new structures may require an engineering inspection and report, as decided by the authority having jurisdiction.
- Training site owners must provide copies of all of the necessary permits (building, electrical, gas) as required by the appropriate authority having jurisdiction. Those municipalities that do not require permits for fire training structures must provide a written declaration of exemption.
- Any gas or electric props built out-of-country must be certified for use in Canada and the Province of Alberta.
- All facilities using live fire must conform to the requirements of *NFPA 1403 Live Fire Training Evolutions*.

**Acquired Structures**

If this site includes an acquired structure, an inspection by a representative of the OFC is required to ensure the structure is safe for use during testing, including live fire, and meets all criteria of NFPA 1402 and 1403. Written approval for the use of an acquired structure for live fire evaluation must also be supplied by the authority having jurisdiction.
