## Government supports for children and families

In addition to child care subsidy, Alberta families may be eligible for the <u>Alberta Child and Family Benefit</u> and other government benefit programs accessed through tax filings. While each family's exact income and tax situation are different, as an example, a family with a single parent with one toddler would be eligible for these subsidy and tax benefit amounts, at different income levels:
