Redeemable term deposits, certificates of deposit or redeemable guaranteed investment certificates must:

Be issued by a chartered bank, credit union, trust company or Alberta Treasury Branch

Be in negotiable form and be assigned to: **His Majesty the King in right of Alberta as represented by the Minister of Forestry and Parks**

Be assigned as to principal only and assignment documents acknowledge as accepted by banks or financial institutions as issuer.
