Summary

The following design exception request is for the following:

The existing section of Highway 24:04 (Km 2 to Km 16) from the existing Junction Highway 817 to the Junction Highway 1 will be reclassified as a local municipal road under the jurisdiction of Wheatland County. Existing alignment Hwy 817:02 will be renamed as Hwy 24 in the future.

Design Bulletin 68/2010 (Draft October 2011) stipulates oversize vehicles (Heavy Hauler, Platform Trailer and the Reactor Transporter) shall be accommodated for all movements through the roundabout. The request is for exclusion of accommodating all three oversize vehicles for all movements at the proposed roundabout located at Hwy 24/:04 and Speargrass Golf Course Community access.

Rationale for Approval/Rejection

- The proposed roundabout is located on the municipal road under the jurisdiction of Wheatland County. The single lane roundabout will accommodate design vehicles WB-21 and WB-23 for all movements.
- Existing Highway 24:04 from the Jct. 817 to Hwy 1 is currently designated as a proposed High Load Corridor (HLC). Refer to HLC map on the AT website on July 4, 2012 (attached). The proposed roundabout on the reclassified segment of Hwy. 24:04 (future municipal road) is acceptable to TSS - Transport Engineering provided that there will be no road bans with respect to the pavement structure on the proposed new HLC in the future. The proposed new HLC will be via existing Hwy 817 to Hwy 1

Additional Mitigation Required


No road bans with respect to the pavement structure on the proposed new HLC in the future.






