Summary

Existing cross-section elements along Glenmore Trail below Deerfoot Trail are inconsistent with Alberta Transportation standards. The use of existing curb and gutter, shy line offsets, shoulder widths, existing barrier types and existing pier protection schemes do not meet Alberta Transportation requirements and best practices for a design speed of 90 km/hr.

Rationale for Approval/Rejection

- The existing cross-section along Glenmore Trail follows the City of Calgary's standards.
- Applying Alberta Transportation's standards would require lengthening of the bridge, widening/replacement of an existing bridge over 11 Street and the purchase of adjacent properties.

Additional Mitigation Required

The consultant proposes to replace the existing Thrie Beam median barrier by a single scope concrete barrier and the existing curbed median will be replaced by asphalt roadway as an inside shoulder to be consistent with the rest of the Glenmore Trail cross section.
