Purpose

The Painter is responsible for finishing and re-finishing furniture, doors and windows.

Responsibilities and Activities

1. Furniture, door and window finishes.

- Spray finish all items manufactured in the cabinet shop.
- Maintain wood finishes of wood furniture by stripping, oiling and refinishing.
- Wash, scrape, burn, fill and stain to desired shade.

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2. Painting and decorating a variety of walls, doors, window frames and other surfaces.

- Oil, sand and further prepare surfaces for painting.
- Use approved painting, trimming and decorating methods, techniques and practices.
- Patch and caulk various surfaces.
- Hang wallpaper.
- Prepare worksites with proper scaffolding and/or swing stage.

3. Maintenance.

- Perform daily maintenance on spray booths and spray equipment.
- Report major maintenance requirements to the supervisor.

4. Estimate material and labour requirements, and miscellaneous responsibilities.

- Estimate material and labour required.
- Procure required materials.
- Maintain records, prepare specifications and respond to emergencies.
- Direct contractors and monitor their work.
- Identify potential painting projects.

Scope

Position independently performs a significant amount of furniture re-finishing that requires stripping old finishes, sanding, overglazing, lacquering, and spray-painting. Other responsibilities include painting a variety of surfaces, hanging wallpaper and estimating material and labour requirements for painting projects.

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The majority of contact is to receive instructions and provide information related to the painting project. While the position provides some direction to contractors, communication is routine for the most part.
