Stream Definition:

System Analyst includes Installation, maintenance, support and planning of information technology infrastructure (software/hardware). Entails the application of computing science principles and theories. Work could involve specialization in: end-user support, applications, technical support, or any combination of these. Work includes: assisting non-EDP users in the use of the computer; or development and/or maintenance of small to medium applications or segments of larger or more complex applications; or evaluation, installation and support of moderately complex system hardware/software.

| System Analyst Level 3 Class #: 513SA | University graduation in computer science or a related discipline plus four years related experience; or equivalent as described. | A related two-year diploma in computer technology or a related discipline from a recognized post-secondary institution and six years related experience; or a related one-year certificate from a recognized post-secondary institution and seven years related experience. |
