What is a student exchange?

These educational experiences are facilitated by Education and Childcare's Student Exchange Programs. An Alberta student will be paired with a student from a region where their target language of study is spoken.

The students will participate in on-line meetings twice per week over a period of six weeks.

Exchange partners will take turns hosting meetings and discussing a variety of topics provided by the exchange coordinator and self-chosen topics.

There are no costs associated with applying to and participating in the virtual exchange.

Eligibility

Grade 9 – 12 students studying French, German, Italian, Spanish or Ukrainian and Grade 10 – 12 students studying Japanese are eligible to apply.

Students must be recommended by their language teachers based on language proficiency, academic standing and personal qualities such as maturity and openness to other cultures. Although some students with lower proficiency may apply, we are happy to have eager applicants.

Virtual exchanges provide valuable personal and academic experiences to students, such as:

- Structured meetings with an exchange partner that allows the student to develop and showcase their language skills;
- Flexibility in scheduling virtual meetings that allows the student to continue athletic or academic extra-curricular activities without interruption;
- Opportunities for developing inter-cultural awareness and appreciation through discussions with exchange partners;
- Building leadership and career skills through preparation and hosting on-line meetings;
- A cost-free way to continue language and cultural development; and
- Preparation for an in-person study abroad experience at a later point in the students' education.
