Application process

Application submission

When a community timber program recruitment opportunity becomes available, an individual or registered corporation completes and submits the community timber manufacturer application form and questionnaire (sample attached).

- an application form and questionnaire received after the posted application period closing date and time may be rejected immediately.
- failure to provide a complete application and questionnaire may result in rejection of the application.
- ambiguous, unclear, or an unreadable application and questionnaire may be rejected at any point in the application review process.

Review process

Screening

Submitted application forms are screened to determine if all mandatory eligibility requirements have been satisfied.

- applications that satisfactorily meet the mandatory eligibility requirements may continue in the application process.
- applications not meeting the mandatory eligibility requirements may be rejected.

Evaluation

Applications meeting the mandatory eligibility requirements are evaluated based on applicant responses provided in the application questionnaire.

- internal government sources may be used to verify and confirm the information provided in the application questionnaire.
- the forest area conducting the review process may request the applicant provide supporting documentation for the information provided the questionnaire.
- as the forest area is not obligated to ask for supporting documentation, at its sole discretion the forest area may reject the application from continuing in the evaluation process.

Scoring

The eligible application questionnaire is evaluated using a point system to determine the competitiveness of the applicant in satisfactorily meeting the criteria in the table below.

To complete the evaluation:

- the weighted score assigned to each measurable within the criteria set is totaled to provide an overall criteria score and,
- each of the criteria score is combined in a weighted fashion to provide a total score for the application.

Application selection

After all eligible applications are evaluated and scored, the forest area recommends to the director the applicant(s) for registration as a community timber manufacturer or community logger based on the highest scoring application.

In the event of two or more applications receive the same high score:

- in an interview with forest area, applicants are required to further describe or provide evidence of the answers provided in the questionnaire.
- the application score may be adjusted based on the interview answers.

It is in the director's sole discretion to accept an applicant into the recruiting community timber program.
