

## Schedule A

### Terms and conditions

1. The holder of this commercial timber permit (CTP) shall fall, skid, remove any timber cut pursuant to this CTP and complete any necessary forest operations following timber removal by this disposition's expiry date.
2. The holder of this CTP shall comply with requirements of the *Alberta Timber Harvest Planning and Operating Ground Rules* (June 4, 2025) as amended or replaced from time to time and the terms and conditions of the CTP.
3. The holder of this CTP shall comply with the requirements of;
  - a) the *Forests Act*, the Timber Management Regulation, and the Forests (Ministerial) Regulation as amended from time to time, and
  - b) All statutes and regulations in Alberta in force, or enacted hereafter from time to time, and as replaced or amended for time to time.
4. The Government of Alberta may, by notice in writing to the disposition holder, require the disposition holder to provide the Government of Alberta, within the time specified in the notice, an audited statement disclosing the information related to the disposition holder's forestry operation that the notice specifies, including, without limitation, information respecting production and sales of primary timber products and reporting of timber dues and levies.
5. This disposition does not convey ownership of the timber until such time as the timber has been cut by the timber disposition holder.
6. This timber permit shall not be construed to contain any implied warranty or condition as to the quantity, quality or fitness for a particular purpose of the volume authorized by this timber permit.
7. A licence, authorization or approval issued under Alberta's *Forests Act*, *Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act*, *Water Act*, or *Public Lands Act* does not mean the proponent has complied with the laws of other levels of government. Proponents are responsible for understanding and ensuring compliance with all applicable legislation, including, without limitation, federal legislation such as the *Migratory Birds Convention Act*, *Fisheries Act* and *Navigation Protection Act*. Proponents are encouraged to contact the regulatory authorities responsible for applicable legislation. ## E09 Permits

9. Harvest boundaries must be delineated using ribbon, Global Positioning System (GPS) or other spatial delineation techniques. Block boundaries must be signed off by a Registered Forestry Professional unless otherwise approved by a Forest Officer.

### **Permit Specific Conditions**

10. Prior to operations, the holder of this CTP shall participate in a pre-start meeting, arranged by the holder of this CTP, with the designated forester at the local forest area office to review designated trails and site-specific information.
11. The holder of this CTP shall meet the requirements of Alberta Timber Harvest Planning and Operating Ground Rule 2.7.3 (Fur Management).
12. Location of access roads, harvest roads and watercourse crossings planned for construction, maintenance, reclamation, or remediation must be clearly identified on the disposition map and described in the appropriate table.
13. The holder of this CTP shall meet the requirements of Alberta Timber Harvest Planning and Operating Ground Rule 2.10 (Grazing and Timber Integration). **Applicable to CTPE090011, CTPE090013, CTPE090014 and CTPE090016.**
14. The holder of this CTP shall avoid cutting aspen wherever possible.
15. Harvest area design should minimize blowdown on neighboring private property.
16. The holder of this CTP shall conduct operations during frozen conditions only.

### **Agreements or Authorizations**

17. The holder of this CTP shall obtain *Public Lands Act* Disposition Holder Agreements (example: road use, easements) prior to entry.
18. The holder of this CTP shall identify, review and follow up where required on any existing Land Use Reservation Program interests where the applicable sector action is "notification" within the proposed harvest area and routes for accessing the proposed harvest area.
19. The holder of this CTP shall apply to the appropriate municipality for the required authorizations where the proposed harvest area and routes for accessing the proposed harvest area intersect an uncleared road allowance as identified in Appendix A by two closely spaced Alberta Township Survey lines.
