

# PUBLIC LAND CAMPING PASS

## Quick facts

The Public Lands Camping Pass supports conservation and the protection of Alberta's beautiful and remote landscapes. Before you head out to camp on public land along the Eastern Slopes of the Rocky Mountains, make sure you have your pass. Be prepared to provide proof of payment to an enforcement officer when requested.

### When?

Passes are required year-round and are valid for 365 days from the date of purchase.

### Where?

The pass applies to public land along the Eastern Slopes of the Rocky Mountains from Grande Prairie to Waterton Lakes National Park. The pass does not apply to private, municipal or federally-owned lands, or to the Kananaskis Conservation Pass area.

Some public land in the pass area is held under agricultural leases. Always contact the leaseholder for permission before accessing these lands and follow any access conditions. 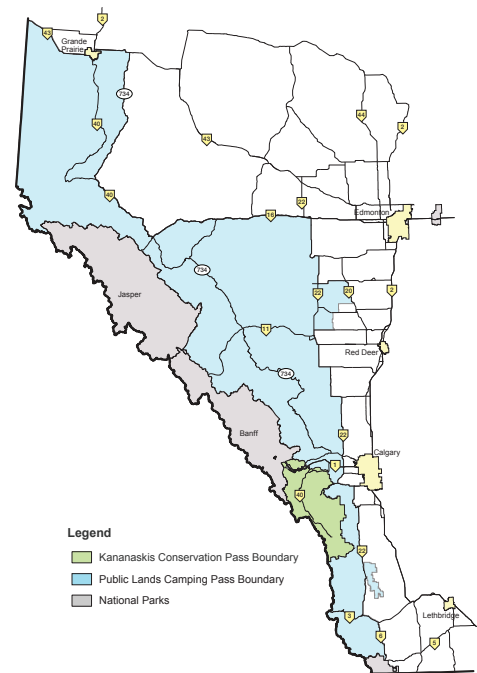
### Who?

Campers 18 years and older must have a pass:

- 3-days \$20/person | Year \$30/person (ages 18+)

### A Public Lands Camping Pass is not required

- to camp on public land outside of the camping pass area or in an established campground where camping fees are already charged
- to use public land for the day for other recreational activities
- to access public land for authorized work or volunteer duties
- for clients of disposition holders where the holder's disposition is for the purpose of camping
- First Nations with Status
- north of the Red Deer River for:
  - Métis Settlement members
  - recognized Métis Harvesters
  - members of the Aseniwuche Winewak Nation
- for persons receiving benefits from:
  - Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped (AISH)
  - Adult Health Benefit
  - Income Support



### Why?

Funds from the pass are being reinvested in the region to improve recreation experiences and help conserve these beautiful landscapes so they can be enjoyed now and for generations to come.

Your pass helps:

- upgrade infrastructure
- improve education
- support conservation and help protect the environment
- monitor and enforce rules
- promote public safety
- provide better waste management

A \$3.25 system processing fee and GST will be applied to every transaction. A one-time Wildlife Identification Number (WIN) purchase is required to access the system (\$8, but with a \$2 discount if purchased online).
