Introduction

In June 2024, Alberta began engagement to help develop a new Plan for Parks. Engagement is being completed in phases. Phase 1 engagement collected feedback from Albertans from June 19 to August 18, 2024, to inform the development of a new draft Plan for Parks. This engagement sought input on the perspectives, preferences and needs of Albertans for the provincial parks system. During Phase 2 engagement, scheduled for 2025, Albertans will review and provide input on the new draft Plan for Parks.

Feedback, along with government direction, research, analysis, and lessons learned from the original plan, will help shape the new Plan for Parks so that current and future generations can continue to discover, value, protect, and enjoy Alberta's parks and the benefits they provide.

This report provides a summary of the Phase 1 engagement approach for the public, Indigenous communities and organizations, and stakeholders, and what was heard during engagement.

Engagement approach

Engagement on the Plan for Parks:

- ensures the new plan is informed by feedback from Albertans across the province;
- explores opportunities for advancing reconciliation in parks;
- seeks to understand new and emerging trends in recreation and camping;
- enables sustainable development of programs and services in parks; and
- supports the long-term success of parks, in an environmentally responsible way.

Key feedback themes

In reviewing the consolidated engagement feedback (on-line survey, written, and meetings), the following themes were identified:

- A majority of those who provided input into the new plan place a high value on both conservation and recreation benefits of Alberta's parks. Though opinions differ on areas for prioritization within the new plan, more than 70% of respondents value both conservation and recreation opportunities within the provincial parks system.
- There is limited support for the proposed updated Plan for Parks vision statement. Though far more say they are in support (47%) than not (16%), more than one-third of respondents are neutral or unsure about the proposed updated vision statement.
- There is broad support for the principles of Sustainability, Accountability, and Equitable Access principles; more than half also support the Reconciliation principle. Many suggestions for additional guiding principles emphasize a focus on conservation.

- In achieving the vision, feedback emphasized the need to conserve natural environments and ecosystems. In addition, many favoured maintenance or expansion of existing opportunities over new development.
- A quarter (25%) of Albertans expressed support for additional user fees. However, Albertans expressed a desire to see user fees in parks reinvested in park facilities and programs.
- Feedback indicated unfamiliarity with the role of partnerships in Alberta's provincial parks and would need more information to decide whether they support expanding them. In support (33%), Not in support (18%) Unsure (47%).
- Feedback expressed support for increasing access and providing new or expanded recreation opportunities provided they are done in a manner that is sustainable and keeps things basic. There was a preference for basic and low-cost options for campsite development over higher-service levels.

Development of a new draft Plan for Parks

Phase 1 engagement informed development of a new draft Plan for Parks that Albertans will review and provide input on as part of Phase 2 engagement. Below is a summary of how Phase 1 engagement informed the new draft plan:


- Engaging on an updated draft vision statement informed the decision to return to the original vision statement, and to clarify "provincial parks", so that: Alberta's provincial parks inspire people to discover, value, protect and enjoy the natural world and the benefits it provides for current and future generations.
- Engaging on four potential guiding principles (Accountability, Equitable Access, Reconciliation, and Sustainability) informed the development of the enduring goals and outcomes presented in the new draft plan.
- Engaging on options related to programs, services and partnerships informed the development of supporting actions presented in the new draft plan.






Thinking about the updated vision statement for Alberta's parks, I am:








To what degree do you support creating more equitable access in Alberta's parks in the following ways?



To what degree do you support increasing campsite availability in Alberta's parks in the following areas?






Which of the following campsite development options would you support in Alberta's parks?




Are you familiar with the role "Friends of" partner groups play in enhancing Alberta's provincial parks?




Do you support expanding the role of partner-provided services, programs and conservation efforts in Alberta's parks? (e.g., "Friends of" groups, facility operators)



Which of the following options to enhance tourism and local visitor experiences would you support in Alberta's parks?






Which of the following options to enhance nature conservation and education in Alberta's parks would you support?










