Release of High-Risk Offender – Michael Andrew SCOTT



In the interest of public safety, the Calgary Police Service is issuing the following public information and warning in regards to the relocation of a high risk offender.

Michael Andrew SCOTT, 44, has returned to the Calgary community today, Wednesday, Nov. 1, 2017. SCOTT is currently subject to a long term supervision order; his previous convictions include sexual assault, aggravated assault, forcible confinement, robbery, uttering threats and breaching court orders. The majority of his crimes have occurred in the Calgary area.

SCOTT has been the subject of two prior public warnings, following a 12.5-year sentence for three sexual assaults and a seven-year sentence for aggravated assault, forcible confinement and break and enter.

SCOTT will now be monitored by the Calgary Police Service High Risk Offender Program.

He is described as Caucasian, 5'10" tall, and 190 pounds, with brown hair and brown eyes. A photo of SCOTT is available on The City of Calgary Newsroom.

The Calgary Police Service is issuing this information and warning after careful deliberation and consideration of all related issues, including privacy concerns, in the belief that it is clearly in the public interest to inform the members of the community of the release of SCOTT.

Members of the public are advised that the intent of the process is to enable members of the public to take suitable precautionary measures and not to embark on any form of vigilante action.
