August 2024 – Mass resignation of council and appointment of Official Administrator (OA)

November 2024 – Village elects a new council


March 2025 – Second mass resignation of council

March 2025 - Initiation of Viability Review

August 2025 - Procurement of firm to conduct Infrastructure Audit



What is a viability review?

A **viability review** is an objective review of a municipality's governance, finances, infrastructure, and services that provides options on how the community can become viable in the future.





This viability review will:

Engage residents, electors, the village, Mountain View County, and municipal associations

Focus on solutions to enable Cremona to be viable over the long-term

Provide factual unbiased information and include recommendations for long-term viability

Move Cremona beyond the status quo



How do viability reviews relate to dissolution?

Viability Review

- Once initiated by the minister, a viability review must:
 - Review a municipality's community, governance, administration,
 finances, infrastructure, and services; and
 - Develop options for long-term viability in a Viability Review
 Report.
- Dissolution is one of the options considered.

Alberta

How do viability reviews relate to dissolution?

Remain and Make Changes

- Minister issues directives the municipality must follow
- Ministry staff meet with council to review directives and next steps
- Annual follow-up meetings and submissions for five years
- Ministry staff available to answer questions and provide resources

Dissolution

- Restructuring process where a municipality is unincorporated and becomes a hamlet in the neighbouring municipality
- Requires a viability review
- Ministry staff support the village and county during the transition
- If selected, anticipated
 January 1, 2027



What are the roles and responsibilities?





- Leads the viability review process
- Informs residents and electors of events
- Hosts public information sessions
- Writes the viability review report
- Conducts the vote of electors





Village and County

- Complete an infrastructure audit (village)
- Provide information about municipal operations
- Provide input through the Viability Review Support Group (VRSG)
- Assist with communications to residents and electors



What funding is available? (Alberta Community Partnership)

During a viability review:

- Funding to assist the review municipality with an infrastructure audit.
- Minister approved \$150,000 for this audit.

If dissolution occurs, Mountain View County would be eligible to apply for post-restructuring funding based on the village population:

- 1. Transitional Stream to integrate the village's governance, administration, and legislation into those of the county \$432,500
- 2. Infrastructure Stream for make hamlet improvements \$1,447,500

Total of \$1,880,000



What is the intent of the directives?

Assist Cremona to:

- Move forward in a sustainable manner and achieve a viable future.
- Become the foundation for a long-term action plan.

Recommendations starting with:

- "a municipality must" when legislation is not being followed; and
- "a municipality should consider" when an action could benefit the municipality's long-term viability and is suggested for council consideration.

Some directives are unique to Cremona, others may be like recommendations in other reports.

Municipal administration provides services and implements the direction of council




Village Administration – Purple Paper

The financial health and sustainability of the village budget, including taxes, revenues, and expenditures






Sustainable Finances – Yellow Paper

Physical Infrastructure

Core infrastructure that meets the needs of residents and the community in a safe and appropriate manner




Physical Infrastructure – Light Green Paper

- 1. Does the village's current infrastructure meet the needs of the community?
- 2. What infrastructure projects are most important to the village's long-term success?
- 3. If infrastructure upgrades are required, what is the best way to pay for needed improvements?
- 4. What worries, if any, do you have about infrastructure in the hamlet if the village dissolves?

Municipal Services

Capacity to provide services that meet community expectations and relevant regulated standards





Municipal Services – White Paper

- 1. What municipal services are important to you?
- 2. Do village services meet the needs of the community?
- 3. What worries, if any, do you have about services in the hamlet if the village dissolves?
