Characterized by many as the "Jewel of the North," Slave Lake is a dynamic town and one of Canada's 10 youngest communities. Slave Lake is located 250km north of Edmonton.

Slave Lake is a tourist hub - within 15 minutes of town you will discover the Lesser Slave Provincial Park, Alberta's 6th largest Provincial Park, Canada's most northern Bird Observatory, Alberta's easternmost foothills, Marten Mountain, and the most beautiful white sand beaches in Alberta! Lesser Slave Lake is the largest lake in Alberta and offers a lot of recreational activities throughout all four seasons, including but not limited to, camping, fishing, ice fishing, hiking, off-roading, skiing, sledding, and boating. The municipality has multiple facilities to foster fun recreational activities – including an aquatics centre, a multi-recreational centre and various parks and playgrounds.

What's happening in the Town of Slave Lake?

If selected as our Intern, you will see these things happening in our community and organization:

- Downtown Revitalization Program: In 2016-17, the Town of Slave Lake undertook an extensive public engagement initiative and developed the Downtown and Main Street Area Structure Plan. This Plan provides a framework for revitalization of downtown and Main Street areas and outlines a series of catalyst projects with several initiatives completed including, but not limited to, the Rennie Hall Plaza redesign.
- Business and Commercial Municipal Tax Incentive Program: providing a municipal tax incentive to attract commercial and industrial investors and promote expansion by existing investors through providing an exemption to a portion of municipal property taxes attributable to the differential between the pre-construction assessment and the post-construction assessment for eligible property.
- Rural Renewal Stream: The Rural Renewal Stream supports the attraction and retention of newcomers to rural Alberta through a community-driven approach that supports local economic development needs and contributes to

Aboriginal people, The Town of Slave has hosted one Indigenous led cultural training session for staff with more
sessions planned in 2024.

Proposed intern activities

Some key and vital initiatives the intern will undertake include:

- Assisting with the implementation of Community Engagement Programs, working alongside our Communications and Economic Development team to implement the strategic communication plan.
- Working alongside administration to assist with the roll-out of an ERP (Enterprise Resource Planning) system.
- Identifying and assisting with applications for government grant projects, for example, renewable energy.
- Assisting with the development, modification and implementation of Council and Administration policies.

As the intern acquires experience throughout these areas, they will gain a deeper understanding of municipal government operations. In addition, they will learn about the Council-Administration relationship and gain an appreciation for project management, strategic planning and how our departments work simultaneously with one another. The intern will gain an appreciation of how municipal decisions and initiatives are formed and performed.
