Municipal Internship Work Plan Fact Sheet

The municipal internship work plan is designed to help plan and guide an intern's activities and professional development. It lists a variety of quality activities that a host organization can choose from to provide interns with a range of experiences, so they may build a solid foundation of knowledge about municipal government and develop skills and competencies for successful careers in the municipal field.

Prospective host municipalities should identify how they might provide meaningful work for their intern, regardless of the program stream, in each of the core module areas as well as a few of the non-core areas featured below. Municipalities that do not have the capacity or ability to provide work in one of the core modules may wish to partner with another municipality that can provide learning opportunities in these critical areas.

A detailed, customizable work plan that includes a list of recommended activities for core and non-core modules will be provided to host organizations selected to participate in the program. The topics and activities recommended for each module have been developed through consultations with municipal professionals, recommendations from past interns and supervisors, and from the program team's knowledge of adult learning and development strategies.
