

Voter Identification – Viability Review Vote of Electors

In order to vote on a question of dissolution proof of identity and current residence is required. Either of the following options will be accepted.

- 1) One piece of identification issued by a Canadian government, whether federal, provincial or local, or an agency of that government, that contains a photograph of the person, the person's name and the address of the person's residence.

Note: A Government of Alberta driver's licence or Government of Alberta issued identification card that contains a post office box number address will be acceptable as voter identification if it still contains the person's photograph and name.

- 2) The elector makes a statement and provides two pieces of identification authorized by the Chief Electoral Officer, each of which establishes the elector's name and at least one of which establishes the elector's current address.

Documents containing the person's name and address will be accepted including:

- bank or credit card statement or personal cheque;
- government cheque or cheque stub;
- income or property tax assessment notice;
- insurance policy or coverage card;
- letter from a public curator, public guardian or public trustee;
- pension plan statement of benefits, contributions or participation;
- residential lease or mortgage statement;
- statement of government benefits (for example, employment insurance, old-age security, social assistance, disability support or child tax benefit);
- utility bill (for example, telephone, public utilities commission, television, hydro, gas or water); and
- vehicle ownership, registration or insurance certificate.
