

# How to Vote – Viability Review Vote of Electors

<p><b>Step 1:</b> Check-in</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Go to your voting place during opening hours.</li> <li>• An election worker will help you.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Step 2:</b> Show your ID (identification)</p>	<div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-between;"> <div style="width: 48%;"> <p><b>Path A</b></p> <p>If your name is on the permanent electors register (PER) and is correct:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bring one piece of ID issued by a Canadian government (whether federal, provincial or local, or an agency of that government) that shows your photo, name, and residential address (this includes an Alberta driver’s licence or Alberta ID card, even if the address shown is a post office box). If you do not have a photo ID as noted above, follow Path B)</li> <li>• You <u>do not</u> need to complete or sign a statement (Form 13).</li> <li>• Process:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Your ID is verified.</li> <li>✓ Your name is confirmed on the PER.</li> <li>✓ You are issued a ballot.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </div> <div style="width: 48%;"> <p><b>Path B</b></p> <p>If your name is NOT on the permanent electors register (PER), or your information is missing or incorrect, or if your name is on the PER and correct but you do not have the required form of photo ID:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bring one piece of ID issued by a Canadian government (whether federal, provincial or local, or an agency of that government) that shows your photo, name, and residential address (this includes an Alberta driver’s licence or Alberta ID card, even if the address shown is a post office box), or one piece of ID from the list below that shows your name and current address.</li> <li>• You <u>must</u> complete and sign a statement (Form 13).</li> <li>• Process:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Your ID is verified.</li> <li>✓ At a future time, your information will be added or corrected on the PER.</li> <li>✓ You are issued a ballot.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </div> </div> <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 10px; margin-top: 20px;"> <p><b>Examples of acceptable IDs:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Driver’s licence or identification card;</li> <li>• bank or credit card statement or personal cheque;</li> <li>• government cheque or cheque stub;</li> <li>• income or property tax assessment notice;</li> <li>• insurance policy or coverage card;</li> <li>• letter from a public curator, public guardian or public trustee;</li> <li>• pension plan statement of benefits, contributions or participation;</li> <li>• residential lease or mortgage statement;</li> <li>• statement of government benefits (for example, employment insurance, old-age security, social assistance, disability support or child tax benefit);</li> <li>• utility bill (for example, telephone, public utilities commission, television, hydro, gas or water); or</li> <li>• vehicle ownership, registration or insurance certificate.</li> </ul> </div>
<p><b>Step 3:</b> Cast your ballot</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mark your ballot in private.</li> <li>• Fold the ballot so your choice is hidden, and the election worker’s initials are visible. If permitted, the election worker may allow you to place your ballot into the ballot box yourself.</li> <li>• You must immediately leave the voting station.</li> </ul>
