

# Get **Naloxone.** Save a life.

Naloxone is a medication that can temporarily reverse the effects of an opioid overdose and can help save lives while emergency medical assistance is on the way.

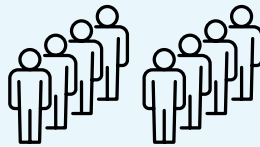
The Government of Alberta provides free injectable naloxone kits to Albertans who may be at risk of experiencing or witnessing an opioid overdose. It is an important part of Alberta's recovery-oriented system of care, providing immediate, life-saving support for Albertans.

## FREE OF CHARGE



**Free** injectable naloxone kits are available to Albertans.

## PROVINCEWIDE



Kits are available at **more than 2000** pharmacies and community organizations.

## STRONG IMPACT



More than **1.5 million kits** have been distributed since launching in 2016.

### Starting October 1, 2026:

- Individuals accessing free naloxone kits through pharmacies will be required to provide a personal health number.
- Individuals will get one kit at a time, to a maximum of five per day.

Individuals do not need to provide a personal health number when accessing kits through a community-based organization, as these organizations do not have the authority to collect this information.

If you need a kit immediately and cannot provide your personal health number, speak with your pharmacist.

Naloxone is safe for all ages. Naloxone kits have an expiry date and should be replaced before they expire.

Naloxone cannot typically be self-administered during an overdose, so it is important that friends, family members, caregivers and bystanders know how to recognize the signs of an overdose and use naloxone to save a life.
