

# Highway 8 Eastbound Elbow River Bridge

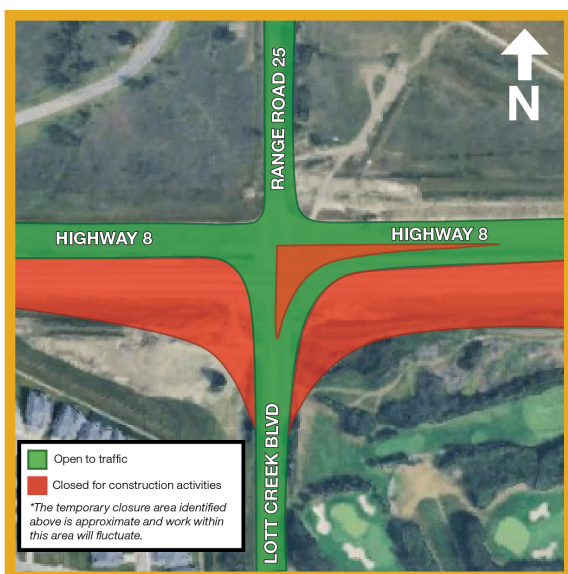
## Upcoming Traffic Impacts, Range Road 25 / Clearwater Drive

Starting the week of August 17, 2026, Highway 8 eastbound traffic will be shifted onto the new westbound lanes. At this time, the future Highway 8 eastbound lanes will be temporarily closed to public traffic for construction until the opening of the new eastbound bridge.

### Intersection Work



This closure will require ongoing traffic pattern changes at the intersection of Highway 8 and Lott Creek Blvd / Range Road 25. All traffic movements will be maintained during traffic detour. The intersection, westbound and eastbound lanes will remain open during this work and access to the surrounding community/ businesses will be maintained.



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### What to expect

#### Speed Limit Reductions

A reduced speed limit of 60 km/h will be in place throughout the work zone to help keep members of the public and those working on the site safe.

#### Traffic Impacts

During construction, traffic impacts will be communicated through onsite signage, and on-site personnel as needed.

#### Work Hours

When possible, work will occur during daylight hours from Monday – Saturday to reduce overall public impact; some work may extend into the evening if required. The contractor is permitted to work 24/7 when nighttime and weekend activities are required.

#### Traffic Control Personnel

Traffic control personnel will be present as needed to direct the flow of traffic, and onsite conditions will continue to change over the course of this work. Please be mindful and obey site personnel and signage.

#### Parking

Parking is not permitted along the highway or within construction limits. This area remains an active construction site with heavy machinery and workers present; drivers are reminded to obey posted signage and drive with care. Designated Elbow River access points can be found using the City of Calgary's River Access Map.
