Report My Collision online service: Albertan support

Report My Collision (RMC) is an online service that provides Albertans with a way Description

to report most collisions without the needing to visit a law enforcement agency

(LEA) in person.

The purpose is to reduce red tape and make collision reporting more convenient Purpose

for Albertans. It supports better data privacy and quality by having a uniform

reporting service across Alberta.

RMC will be available to select municipalities in May 2025. Releases to other **Availability**

municipalities will continue through spring 2025, with full deployment anticipated

by late summer 2025.

RMC is integrated with Alberta.ca accounts. Albertans reporting a collision will Authentication

Eligible Types of Currently only single-vehicle or property damage only vehicle collisions can be reported via RMC. Examples of these kinds of collisions include animal strikes, Collisions

striking an object (e.g., light post, guard rail), or if the vehicle ran off the road or

was the subject of a hit and run.

Albertans will be required to provide information about the collision such as Required location, date and time, any contributing factors, photos of the damaged area(s), Information

as well as information about the driver, the registered owner (if different), the

vehicle involved in the collision and its insurance details.

RMC is only available to drivers that hold an Alberta driver's licence and have a Limitations

verified Alberta.ca account. Out-of-province drivers must report their collision at a

LEA.

Albertans will receive automated emails for any status updates, including approval Collision Report or rejections of their collision reports by law enforcement. Albertans can also Status

check their status anytime on their RMC dashboard.

Damage Stickers

Once a report has been approved, a digital damage sticker will be generated and made available for download on the users RMC dashboard. This digital sticker can be printed, emailed or viewed on a mobile device for vehicle repair shops to verify the collision has been reported and to authorize repairs.

Data Privacy

RMC and LEAs will collect the same information as authorized under Sec 11(2.1) of the Traffic Safety Act (TSA), and regulations as they currently do.
